Vermont delegate Sarah G. stressed the importance

of an informed group conscience. "The more informed people there are to carry the A.A. message, the faster and further it will be carried," she said. "Without the principle of rotation", she noted,

"responsibility for carrying the message would rest in the hands of just a handful of people, thus causing the Fellowship to become alienated from our Third Legacy of Service."
